Dr. Baum has served on the Board of Directors of the National Association for Gifted Students and is past president and co-founder of the Association for the Education of Gifted Underachieving Students. She is recipient of the Weinfeld Group's Life-time Achievement Award and the recipient of the 2012 CAG Friend of the Gifted Award, for her work in educating the twice exceptional child.
